

TWO QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

Genesis 2:16-18, 3:1-9

SERIES SUMMARY...

Today, we begin a NEW sermon series entitled **'Hey Jesus...?'** We will spend a better part of the summer considering the many questions that people asked Jesus throughout the gospels. There were questions about religion, faith, fear, eternity, politics, money, and culture, just to name a few. Jesus answered each question in order to reveal His heart for the questioner so they could grow in friendship with Him.

KEY IDEA...

Jesus invites us to come to Him with our questions so that we might experience His heart for us.

A FEW QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER...

- 1. *Reflect:* If you could ask Jesus just one question, what would it be? If questions have a way of revealing our heart, what does your one question reveal about your heart?
- 2. Does knowing that Jesus is bigger than your biggest question encourage you to come to Jesus with ALL of your questions? Are there any questions that you feel like you cannot or are not permitted to ask Jesus? Why limit your questions?
- 3. The first recorded question that humanity was confronted with came from God's enemy Satan. 'Did God really say...?' Read Genesis 3:1. Why does the serpent begin with a question? What is his intent in doing this?
- 4. Read **Genesis 2:16-18** and **Genesis 3:2-6**. What did God actually say and how did Eve edit what God said? Why does it matter that she added 'don't touch'? What are the consequences when we begin to 'edit' God's Word for our own purposes?
- 5. How do you (currently or in the past) edit God's Word and what impact has this had on you? What truth do you need to be reminded of?



6. Read **Genesis 3:8-9**. When man walked away from God, God walked towards man with one question – **'Where are you?'** What does this one question reveal about God's heart for His creation? How are you currently answering this question?
