THIS WEEK'S VERSES

- **Gen. 1:27** ²⁷ So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them: male and female he created them.
- Eph. 2:14, 15-16 ¹⁴ For Christ himself has brought peace to us. He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down the wall of hostility that separated us. ¹⁵ He did this by ending the system of law with its commandments and regulations. He made peace between Jews and Gentiles by creating in himself one new people from the two groups. ¹⁶ Together as one body, Christ reconciled both groups to God by means of his death on the cross, and our hostility toward each other was put to death. ¹⁷ He brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were far away from him, and peace to the Jews who were near.
- **Gal. 3:26-27** ²⁶ For you are all children* of God through faith in Christ Jesus. ²⁷ And all who have been united with Christ in baptism have put on Christ, like putting on new clothes.
- Rev. 7:9-10 9 After this I saw a vast crowd, too great to count, from every nation and tribe and people and language, standing in front of the throne and before the Lamb. They were clothed in white robes and held palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰ And they were shouting with a great roar, "Salvation comes from our God who sits on the throne and from the Lamb!"

- 7. What impact could the Church of Jesus make on this issue if every Christian were living out the Gospel in their community? How can we be a part of the solution?



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
